SUPPORT FUNCTIONS OF THE GREATER NEW ORLEANS COUNCIL

 Supports the Andrew J. Higgins Squadron of the U. S. Naval Sea Cadet Corps. This local squadron which works with and trains young "sea cadets", consists of registered adult leaders (combination of commissioned officers and instructors), and young cadets, who are drilled and trained in Naval etiquette, boat handling, physical fitness, emergency medical treatment, and other areas.

The Greater New Orleans Council is proud to support this Squadron, which has produced exemplary young men and women through its training.

- Supports the Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps of Tulane University, and local Naval Junior ROTC units, providing awards and certificates to outstanding members, and an engraved Naval Sword to the outstanding officer candidate at Tulane upon graduation.
- Supports the Blue & Gold crews of the USS New Orleans (LPD-18), an amphibious transport dock ship, and the USS Louisiana (SSBN – 743), a fleet ballistic submarine, by sending local chefs to train the ships' cooks to make creole and Cajun recipes.
- Supports the New Orleans Military and Maritime Academy, a public charter school where all students are cadets in the Marine Corps JROTC program. This school has set aside for military children and is one of the highest rated academic high schools in the area.
